Declaration on the Participation in SRAM Social Ride

I would like to take part in the SRAM Social Ride organized by SRAM Deutschland GmbH or any agent acting on SRAM Deutschland GmbH behalf (each an "Organizer") at Girona on May 1st, 2024 (hereinafter "Event").

I confirm that I have been informed by Organizer about the risks associated with my participation in the Event. Organizer has briefed me on, inter alia, the length, the type of terrains and the general difficulty level of the bike ride. Furthermore, I am aware that these risks are subject to my personal condition and abilities as well as to external factors, such as weather conditions or the behavior of others.

I confirm that my personal bike is in good condition and fit for the Event, including any applicable regulations.

I am aware of and commit to adhering to all rules and regulations governing my participation in the Event, in particular any applicable road traffic regulations and the specific rules of the Event (if any). In case of specific Event rules, these have been or will be communicated to me in due course before or on the day of the Event. Throughout the entire Event, I shall act with caution and respect for others and in a manner that neither me nor any third party will be harmed or endangered or that any third party, if not unavoidable under the specific circumstances, is obstructed or inconvenienced.

I was advised by Organizer to wear personal protective gear. As a minimum, wearing an appropriate bicycle helmet is required for all rides. Depending on the choice of ride (e.g., trail, downhill), my abilities and the overall conditions of the ride, I will carefully consider the use of, inter alia, the following gear: gloves, full-face helmet, knee and elbow pads, back and chest protectors.

I hereby expressly waive all claims, whether in contract, tort or otherwise, of damages and consequential damages that may occur in connection with my participation in the Event unless it is established that such damages either (i) resulted from an injury to life, body or health or (ii) did arise from a breach of a duty of Organizer that is crucial for my participation in the Event and that I am entitled to and did rely on ("cardinal duty") or (iii) were caused by Organizer acting with intent or gross negligence. For damages arising from a breach of a cardinal duty as a result of simple negligence, Organizer can only be held liable to the extent the damage was reasonably foreseeable.
